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Why host a Symposium



The Association works with our 20+ Professional Communities to create Professional Development Symposia.

Symposia allow for peer-to-peer networking, idea-sharing, and discussion of issues and challenges of common interest. These symposia offer enabling garden professionals throughout the United States and internationally to attend. Topics are focus upon specific segments of the industry; 2–3 symposia are offered each year.

BENEFITS OF HOSTING A SYMPOSIUM INCLUDE:

1

Highlight your region and garden(s) as an expert within a specific segment of the public garden industry, showcasing your expertise through staff presentations and garden tours.

2

Provide your staff with the opportunity to attend symposium sessions and network with their peers for free or discounted rates.

3

Celebrate your garden and its accomplishments through a professional development event scaled to fit your garden.

4

Collaborate in designing the symposium by providing input on evening events, keynote speakers, theme, and other key elements.

The Symposium Host(s) commit to the following responsibilities...

- ✓ Host gardens will provide facilities and A/V to accommodate Symposium attendees, including:
 - Facility rental fees for the garden for all spaces used by attendees
 - Audio/Visual costs at the garden for all spaces used by attendees
- ✓ Host gardens are financially responsible for, at minimum, one evening reception and/or dinner and all associated costs.
- ✓ At least one host garden staff member must participate on the Symposium Planning Committee. The committee holds regular monthly or bi-monthly planning meetings/calls beginning 12–18 months before the symposium.
- ✓ Staff of the host garden will act as the liaison between the host institution(s) and the Symposium Planning committee, providing local expertise as well as communicating with other host staff members (events staff, marketing, volunteers, photography, catering, etc.) when needed.

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Why host a Regional Learning Series



This event series is designed to provide attendees a behind-the-scenes, in-person look at member gardens across the country! Our one-day Regional Learning Series take intensive dives into current public garden topics and showcase unique facilities, events, and displays while encouraging connections with Association members within the region.

BENEFITS OF HOSTING A REGIONAL LEARNING SERIES INCLUDE:

- 1** Showcase your public garden and highlight unique facilities, programs, and approaches to common problems.
- 2** Highlight the work of your staff and provide for peer-to-peer recognition of accomplishments.
- 3** Cultivate connections between your staff and staff from other gardens in similar positions—developing long-lasting impact beyond the event.
- 4** Gather fellow garden leaders to address regional problems and opportunities.

We are excited to showcase your garden through a Regional Learning Series.

- ✓ The Association will help facilitate logistics, set up registration, and provide a staff member onsite to help run the event.
- ✓ The host garden is expected to provide facilities, programming, logistical support, and any offered snacks/meal(s).
- ✓ Staff from host gardens are welcome to attend the full event at no charge.
- ✓ These events range from half-day to full-day, morning or afternoon, meals included or on your own—it's up to you!
- ✓ Regional Learning Series events operate on a 50/50 profit share, with all registration fees split evenly between Garden and Association.

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Why host a Board Meeting



The Association's Board of Directors meets quarterly to review and advise on the stability and growth of the Association. - ✓ Arrange breakfast and lunch during the meeting (at cost to APGA)
- ✓ Host a dinner for APGA Board members and garden stakeholders (optional, at cost to garden)
- ✓ Provide tours and/or onsite garden events (optional)



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
